We have fruits growing too.

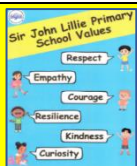
Look at the strawberry hiding under the leaves while it ripens.

## Doorstep Library Home Reading Visits

Doorstep Library is a community-focused literacy charity dedicated to bringing the magic of books and the joy of reading directly into the homes of children aged 0-11 across London and beyond who need our support.

Our Home Reading visits take place **once a week during term time, after school**. We recruit and train reading volunteers to help introduce young children to the pleasure and benefits of reading. Equipped with a reading stool and a backpack brimming with books, our volunteers will visit the family in the home or on the doorstep, to read and share books and stories.

We encourage parents/carers to get involved in the reading visits, leaving behind a selection of books behind for children and parents to continue sharing together. We also provide tips and tools for parents and carers to help them continue reading and sharing stories with their children when we aren't there.

- Visits take place on a set evening (**Monday, Tuesday or Thursday**) between 4:30pm - 7pm, and each visit lasts approximately 20 minutes.
- We currently work across the following boroughs: **Camden, Hammersmith & Fulham, Lambeth, Kensington & Chelsea, and Westminster.**
- We can continue weekly visits for up to 12 months.
- No costs or fines for books which are lost or damaged.
- Our reading services are completely **FREE** for families.
