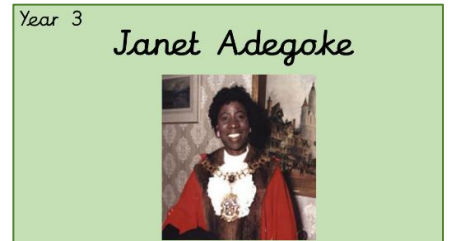
Have a very happy half term 😊

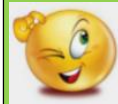
Year 5 and 6 pupils have been asked to help you out at home and make sure that they get their PE kit ready for their PE day.

This will prepare them for when they go to secondary school.

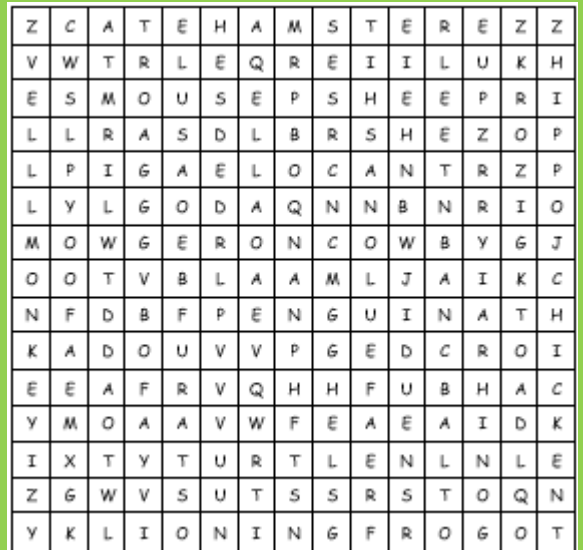
We have welcomed Miss Malloy into our Nursery.
