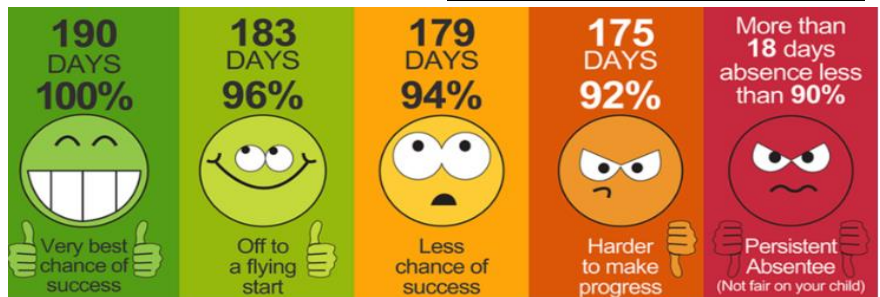

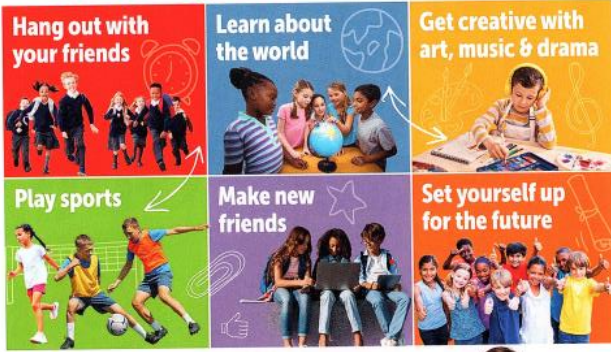

Important information for parents & carers

Your child being absent from school can have a serious impact on their learning. Government data from 2019 shows that 84% of Key Stage 2 students with perfect attendance met the expected standard in exams, while only 40% of those who were frequently absent did so.

School attendance is also important for your child's social development, confidence and self-esteem.

Parents are required by law to make sure their children receive a full-time education that meets their needs, and you could be prosecuted if you fail to do this. You can be fined if you take your child out of school during term time without permission from their school.

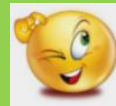
